

Safeguarding Policy

- 1. All parents/carers to be made aware that they are responsible for the child/children in their care at all times.
- 2. All visitors attending the group without a child to be approached and asked for identification and purpose for attending the group. All visitors should be asked to sign in.
- 3. Visitors should never be allowed unsupervised access to any child while on the premises.
- 4. All parents/carers/helpers to be made aware that in accordance with the law should they feel that a child, is not being treated in a correct manner or in an abusive way, which may endanger the well-being of a child they owe a duty of care to report any incident to the group leader.
- 5. Group to encourage positive, good behaviour for parents/carers.
- 6. In the event of a child being lost, someone should stand at each entry/exit door and on the stairs whilst the child is looked for inside and out.
- 7. All helpers working with children are in possession of a DBS disclosure (Disclosure and Barring Service).
